Supervised Worker's Licence Checklist

Electrical Apprentice

An electrician must be licenced to carry out electrical installation work in Victoria. If you are not eligible for an A Grade Electrician's licence, you may be eligible for a Supervised Worker's Licence. This is only a short-term licence to allow you to carry out electrical installation work under the supervision of an A Grade Electrician until you have met Energy Safe Victoria's requirements to apply for an A Grade Electrician's licence.

If you have completed an electrician's apprenticeship in Victoria, use the checklist below to determine your eligibility to apply for a Supervised Worker's Licence with Energy Safe Victoria.

If you reach the nominal completion date of your training contract (four years from your start date) and you have not yet completed your schooling, including your on-the-job training ('profiling'), do not apply for a Supervised Workers Licence. You must extend your training contract to legally continue carrying out electrical installation work.
